- a. Never had a paid job.
- **b.** Elementary occupations: unskilled workers in services, labourers in agriculture, fishing, construction, manufacturing and transport. Includes domestic staff and other cleaning staff, food preparation assistants, urban waste collectors, street vendors, etc., agricultural, forestry and fishing labourers, labourers in construction, mining and manufacturing industries, transport labourers, unloaders, stockers, etc.
- C. Operators of fixed or mobile plant and machinery, fitters, drivers. Includes fixed plant and machinery operators, fabricators and assemblers in factories. Locomotive drivers, operators of agricultural machinery and mobile heavy equipment, and seafarers. Drivers of vehicles for urban or road transport.
- d. Troops and sailors in the armed forces.
- e. Craftspeople and skilled workers in manufacturing industries and construction, except plant and machinery operators. Includes structural construction and related workers, construction finishing and installation workers, painters and related workers. Tilers, sheet metal workers, assemblers, blacksmiths, mechanics, electrical workers, precision mechanics, ceramists, glaziers, graphic arts workers, workers in the food, beverage and tobacco industry, workers in the wood, textile, clothing, leather, leather and footwear industries, etc.
- **f. Skilled workers in the agricultural, livestock, forestry and fishing sectors.** Includes agriculture, animal husbandry (including poultry, beekeeping and similar activities), mixed farming, forestry, fishing and hunting.
- g. Protection and security services workers. Includes civil guards, police, firefighters, private security personnel, etc.
- h. Health and care workers. Includes personal care workers in health services, and personal care and services (hairdressers, beauticians and related specialists), travellers' care workers, building maintenance and cleaning supervisors, small accommodation owners, etc.
- i. Catering and trade service workers. Includes waiters, cooks, salaried or proprietary catering workers; shop and warehouse owners and clerks, salespersons, cashiers and ticket office staff (except in banks), etc.
- **j. Accounting, administrative and other clerical staff.** Includes accounting, administrative, financial and other clerical employees: employees in production support services and transport, travel agency employees, receptionists, telephone operators, window clerks, etc.
- **K. Technicians; support professionals.** Science and engineering technicians, supervisors in mining engineering, manufacturing industries and construction. Health technicians, finance and mathematics support professionals, representatives, commercial agents. Administrative management support professionals; law enforcement specialists. Support professionals from legal, social, cultural, sports and related services. Information technology technicians.
- Officers and NCOs in the armed forces.
- **m.** Scientific and intellectual technicians and professionals. Technicians and professionals in health and education and other scientific and intellectual professionals: doctors, nurses, veterinary surgeons, pharmacists, teachers, professionals in the physical, chemical, mathematical and engineering sciences, legal professionals, specialists in the organisation of public administration and business and in marketing, professionals in information technology, social sciences, culture and entertainment.
- **n. Directors and managers.** Members of the executive and legislative bodies; managers of public administration and social interest organisations; executive directors. Directors of administrative and commercial departments, production and operations, managing directors of service companies, etc.
